### Notification of Stakeholder Consultation

As you are aware, the Ministry of Defence is proposing to establish an area of segregated airspace in the vicinity of the current Salisbury Plain Danger Areas in order to accommodate the training requirements of its unmanned aircraft capability.

Issue 2 of the Consultation Document was published in June 2009 and a letter, dated 22 May 2009 (reference DES UAV/Revised ACP/ParishCouncil) advised you of this.

Since publication of Issue 2 of the Consultation Document, the Ministry of Defence has obtained actual noise measurements for the first unmanned aircraft planned to use the proposed airspace. Therefore, as stated in the Initial Stakeholder Feedback Document, this information is now being made available for consideration and a revised Consultation Document (Issue 2.1) has been produced. This document will be uploaded to the consultation website at [www.qinetiq.com/airspace](http://www.qinetiq.com/airspace) on Tuesday 18 August 2009, where it will be available for you to view and download.

Public consultation on this airspace change was due to be concluded on 4 September 2009. However, in order to allow organisations and individuals an appropriate period of time to respond to this revised Consultation Document containing actual noise data, the consultation period has been extended to 30 September 2009. QinetiQ is undertaking this consultation process on behalf of the Ministry of Defence.
